You asked..... Hopefully you will find the background to how your questions are answered here. It will not detail the entire debate or depth of enquiry, just a bit more insight. The full minutes with all other matters discussed can be obtained from WPC clerk on request, or viewed on the website. ⁽ⁱ⁾

Can the lighting be improved for pedestrians using the path from the Church to Crowpill Lane as it is too dark and unsafe with an open rhyne? The PC is unable to site lighting here as the land is privately owned. However, the council wish to make footpaths as usable as possible to reduce car usage, so this remains under review and may be possible to light from the other side of the rhyne in the future.

Can the double yellow lines be extended on Wembdon Rise to prevent parking along the entire section before the traffic lights, parking here creates a bottleneck? Whilst the council is sympathic to this view, they support the view previously offered by Highways at SDC, that the parking acts to slow traffic down and is therefore an advantage. Also the cars parking here are resident's vehicles and preventing them from parking in front of their properties will just move the congestion elsewhere.

The street lights at the entrance to Church Road are frequently out; can they be fixed? The PC is grateful for this being brought to our attention and it has been reported as a fault to be fixed.

Can we have a PC notice board back on Wembdon Hill? This matter has been brought to the council, discussed many times and is difficult to resolve to everyone's satisfaction. The Wembdon Hill and the bus stop boards were discontinued for being too small to meet the requirement that all noticeboards must display the same information. New ones are in situ at the entrance to the playing field and at Trinity Way making a total of 4, all meeting the legal requirements. Communication is supported through the parish paper delivered to each door with more available at the shop, the website and social media updates. The cost of purchasing and siting another board is considerable and, given that it is possible that notice boards may not be a legal requirement in a "paperless working" future, the council did not consider it cost effective at present.

A bit more news.....

Some areas of the playing surface in the children's play area have been repaired. More patches will be repaired as the weather improves. An application has been made to re-route the path as the hedge is removed and construction begins on the adjacent field.

An area of the bank adjacent to the pub has subsided after the recent heavy rainfall. WPC are in discussion with the relevant authorities to secure it.

A pedestrian crossing application from the District Councillors, for Whitegates roundabout has been gratefully received and vigorously supported by WPC.

In line with the road alterations at Sandford Corner, EDF have completed a survey of traffic through Wembdon prior to the new roundabout construction. This will be repeated, once the road is re-opened, for comparison of traffic volume and road usage post roundabout.

WPC is grateful to the Land Drainage Board for acting quickly to remove and make safe a fallen pollarded willow on Church Road, and to WVHPFT for allowing use of their land. These trees are considered iconic to Wembdon but are currently in poor condition. WPC wishes to actively plant new trees to preserve the "street scene" along Church Road, whilst making safe the older split and collapsing ones.

A scheme has recently been advertised whereby the local PCSO's are promoting "post-coding" garden tools to reduce theft from allotments and sheds. If WPC receives sufficient interest from residents, we will look into securing a date for this scheme in Wembdon. Let us know!

Road works at Sandford Corner.



Work is progressing well at Sandford Hill Corner; the dry weather has allowed the engineers to make real headway in March. The team have now switched from working on the north side of the A39 to the south side. The Police and Somerset County Council have been monitoring the traffic flow through the works closely to try and minimise the inconvenience caused. EDF Energy are optimistic that the work can be completed ahead of schedule and that both lanes of the A39 will be open before the busy summer holiday period begins in July."

The Parish Council would like to ensure that everyone in the Parish is fully aware of what is proposed for our primary school by Somerset County Council. It came as a surprise to all of us last summer when a temporary classroom building was placed on the site on the first day of the school holidays. Planning permission hadn't been sought and no public notification was posted. Only after Parish Council intervention did SCC put in a retrospective Planning Application as part of their plan to increase pupil numbers to 420. The PC strongly objected to the application but permission was granted by SCC as the classrooms were already occupied by the new students.

Just before Christmas SCC put in a second Planning Application to build a new and permanent extension to the school to incorporate 4 classrooms. The PC decided to object to this proposal as this would push the total number of students up to 420. The school would then be equal in size to the largest schools in Bridgwater. The PC believe that this would further add to the traffic chaos through the village at the start and end of every school day as all the extra students will arrive by car (there are already more than enough places for all children who live in our parish). We are very concerned about a number of safety issues this proposal will exacerbate both through the village and on the school site. Wembdon just doesn't have the infrastructure to deal with this size of school.

Because of our objection the Application had to go before the Regulation Committee of SCC which met at County Hall and was attended by Anne Reed and Neil Harrison and we were given the opportunity to put our objections forward. After much discussion the Committee voted for the proposal by 9 votes to 1. The extension is scheduled to commence in the very near future and the school will increase its number from September.

Wembdon PC will discuss its response to the decision at the monthly meeting in April. Meanwhile, if anyone wishes to comment on this issue then please contact any of the PC's or the Clerk.

Support our Village

We are at a cross roads, quite literally, in our struggle to retain two things which make us a village. Unless we all do our best to support them we may well lose both the shop and post office, and the pub.

Since the road closure at Sandford corner, both these businesses have lost a large percentage of their normal trade. It seems to us at the Parish Council, that it is rather shocking that the majority of customers seem to come from outside the village, although we suspect that many of us would greatly miss them if they were to disappear. The Parish and District councillors have worked to get notices put on the NDR, however little effect has been seen in any increasing passing trade.

Our message to the residents is a simple one – use them or lose them!



The new Sandford roundabout is due to finish in July. Initial problems in Skimmerton Lane are hopefully now sorted. We informed the Police, so they can keep an eye on the one way system, ensuring that drivers do not come down the one way system the wrong way, as we are concerned for the road safety of that lane. We also are glad to see that the bus is now able to come through Wembdon Village, so that residents can get into town for appointments or work. We are pleased to be able to work with Wembdon Parish Council to make sure signs are on the main road, telling drivers that Wembdon is still open for business.

It was encouraging to see the new Bridgwater Hospital. We are sure quite a few residents took the opportunity of having a look around on the Open Day. After looking around it, it provides such a modern and healthier way of working, we believe this hospital is a credit to Sedgemoor and surrounding area.

It was good to see that another Planning Application for houses at the back of Wembdon Hill was refused at the Planning Committee, both Ian and I objected and spoke at the meeting.

Sedgemoor District Council Staff and Councillors' have been very involved in the flooding at Moorland and Fordgate, helping with many problems that have happened during and after the flooding and will continue to help them for quite a few months to come, you will have seen that it caught the Prime Minister's eye, as he has made many trips to speak to those poor residents that were involved in the floods and had many discussions with Sedgemoor District Council, Somerset County Council and other Agencies to look at the flooding plan for the future. We are delighted to welcome 2 new members to the Community Speed Watch team, who are now fully trained and operational. Many thanks to them from WPC for their commitment to our village, and contribution to making this a safer environment for us all.

It still shocks us at the Parish Council when we receive the data from our speed watch team. In a 45 minute period on a Saturday morning (9:30-10:15am), **96 cars passed the device on Wembdon Rise, 6 of which were speeding, with a top speed of 43mph in a 30mph zone.** This is especially concerning as there is considerable pedestrian usage at this time and the footpaths are narrow or absent along sections of Wembdon Rise. **The majority of this vehicular traffic was noted to be village traffic.** Please, please, please stop and think about this. If we don't care enough to **slow down** for our own children, family, friends and neighbours, how can we campaign to reduce the speed limit and impact on others? **Are Wembdon residents the worst offenders?**
