Latest News.

WPC clerk is now employed to work for us for 14hrs / week to meet the increase demand in work and duties required.

We have now been able to improve some of the footpaths around the village including the paths from Wares Lane to Greenacre and connecting paths from Greenacre to Great Oaks, to facilitate pedestrian access around Wembdon.

The new bin has now been installed at the allotments and will hopefully solve the litter problem up there. Thank you to those volunteering to empty it.

Some maintenance work is due to be carried out on the swings in the playing fields. Unfortunately vandalism to the spring-seesaw in the under 6's area has resulted in this being removed for safety. It will be replaced asap but at a cost of £295 to WPC. Please help us ensure these items are properly used. ©

Damage to the noticeboard at Positano Way has necessitated new glass being installed at a cost of £98.40 to WPC.

The phone box in the village has now been refurbished and cleaned. Despite our requests to the contrary, BT have declined to remove it but agree to clean and maintain it regularly. Please let us know if you have any problems with it.

WPC declined the offer of a bus shelter on Homberg Way in the direction of travel towards Hinkley Point only as the offer required WPC to take over all maintenance costs following installation. It was felt that the financial implications of this may extend beyond WPC capacity. No offer was made for a shelter in the other direction of travel.

WPC continues to liaise with the Highways department at Somerset County Council regarding speeding in the village. Recent data show 93.5% of vehicles on the NDR exceeded the speed limit of 30mph. This is of considerable concern to WPC and representatives from Highways have been invited to attend a WPC meeting to discuss measures to improve this.

In response to Somerset County Council's bus service consultation, WPC gave full support to maintaining local bus routes serving the village. However it was felt that contributing to funding the bus service extended beyond the remit and resources of the parish council.

The bench on Wembdon Hill has fallen into disrepair and is to be replaced.

A diversion order has now been obtained to safely re-route the public footpath, currently across the playing fields, to the perimeter whilst work continues on the Village Hall and recreational ground.

The access gate to the allotments track is now locked from dusk until dawn. This has significantly reduced the anti-social behaviour reported in the area.

A recent police report for the area highlighted a number of low level crimes affecting residents of Wembdon. These included shed and garage break-ins, vandalism and minor thefts. Whilst these may be "low level" it causes considerable distress and inconvenience to those affected so we wish to highlight this and encourage residents to be vigilant and secure their properties.

Allotments

All plots are currently taken and we are operating a waiting list for future growers.

Priority will continue to be given to Wembdon residents

The Parish Council determined to leave rents unchanged this year.

Wembdon Parish Council Precept for 2015/16

A Parish Council receives a small amount, (the "precept") of the local Council Tax.

Funds from central government to District and County Councils are capped. It is likely that these councils will not receive the funding required to maintain all the services that they currently provide to communities. However, the introduction of the Localism Act means that your parish council can decide to spend money to benefit the local community.

In recent years Wembdon Parish Council precept contributions have been utilised to:

- Provide, and improve on, allotments.
- Improve and maintain footpaths
- Purchase of benches
- Maintain play equipment
- Update the Parish website
- Publication of Parish Magazine
- Contribute to the school crossing patrol
- Installation & emptying of litter and dog mess bins
- Purchase of salt bins
- Grass and hedge cutting, and general maintenance.

We have calculated a precept for 2015/16 of £60,330, an increase of £11,950 compared to the previous year. This equates to an increase of 0.74p per month for a band D property. As a Council, we are committed to maintain, improve and develop our parish to provide a clean and safe environment for everyone. We hope as a resident you share our views, and understand and support the financial requirements involved in improving our community.

We welcome feedback from our parishioners. Council Meetings are open to the public and are held on the third Monday of every month. Alternatively any enquiries can be made via the Parish Clerk, Tony Jay at wembdonpc@gmail.com or 07741461982.

Purpose of the Annual Parish Meeting.

An elector may also make suggestions and comment on anything pertinent to the people of Wembdon. This will be welcomed and is the whole purpose of the meeting.

A substantial three course lunch was served by Windsor Catering whilst the wine waiters of the WCA served wine and soft drinks to their worthy guests. Thanks must go to the Trustees of the Sir Bartholomew Mitchell's Charity who kindly donated £200 towards the cost of this year's event. Needless to say, after the wine and festivities everyone left the hall with a smile on their face. News from Sedgemoor District Council, Cllrs Ann Bown & Ian Dyer

- Some of the items over the last year Sedgemoor District Council has accomplished for the residents of Sedgemoor.
- £100 million of public sector investment in Sedgemoor with the new Hospital and Police HQ opening.
- After five years of campaigning, Sedgemoor District Council managed to change government policy on community benefit. Communities in and around Hinkley Point C site will stand to gain upwards of £128 million.
- Over £250 million of investment in housing, including 330 affordable homes - by working with the Homes and Community Agency and other organisations.
- The new swimming pool and café at Trinity Sports and Leisure opened in the spring of 2013. New Facilities include a 6 lane pool, training pool, café, spectator seating and fitness facilities. The emphasis will be on many different flexible uses of the pool to provide accessible activities for the young, elderly, disabled, competitive and social swimmers alike.
- Responding to the worst floods in living memory and helping householders get back into their Homes after months under water.
- Helping to prevent youth homelessness last year around 60 young people became homeless or were at risk of becoming homeless in Sedgemoor.
- Economic Activity rates in Sedgemoor are up, reaching 85% at the end of 2013, that's higher than the national and regional averages.
- 2,000+ new jobs created in Sedgemoor area by being a pro-business authority.
- We are also the lowest council tax in the County, whilst still delivering jobs and growth into Sedgemoor.
- Sedgemoor District Council continues to support the work of local community groups through the awarding of various grants in 2013/14, 49 grants with a total value of £57,472 were awarded to organisations.
- During 2013 Sedgemoor attended 7 "Sedgemoor on the Road" events, all of which were well attended. Display boards, and information leaflets were taken to each event to offer help and advice on accessing Council services.
- The Council collects 98.0% of the Council Tax owed, which is above the national average of 97.4%.
- 100% of Lifeline emergency callouts arrived at the property with 45 mins.


School Traffic Plan Update.

With our school extension now underway we are, and have been, very conscious of the traffic problems immediately outside the school and further into Inwood Estate. As our pupil numbers increase so the traffic issues will become more prominent and as a result we are involved in regular meetings with the County Council, Highways, the Parish Council, the PCO, Parents, Governors, Sustrans and The Bridgwater Way in order to try and find ways forward to alleviate the congestion and improve safety for all involved.

Highways and the County Council are supporting us with plans to improve the road markings along Brantwood Road and outside school. Our School Council have written to all parents with their concerns and are in the process of writing to our local residents to explain what is happening in school.

Sustrans have helped us to develop a robust travel plan and they have worked with children in school to encourage safe walking and cycling. With their help we will be conducting travel and speed surveys of traffic in Brantwood Road. We continually work to inform parents of the importance of safe and courteous driving and parking through regular newsletters. Educating our parents is vital and working together we will make a difference for our school and the community.
