Latest News:

The condition of Moores Lane had been brought to the council's attention. When previously assessed by Highways it had not been considered a safety risk, following further communication from WPC this has now been repaired.

The land previously referred to as the Persimmon Land has now been renamed Wembdon Park Land.

The Police Report records an increased number of burglaries in Wembdon. Please be vigilant to secure your property, doors and windows.

The fallen tree in the playing fields has been tidied up and made safe.

The dog waste bin at the lower end of the playing fields has been relocated to the other side of the bridge for dog walkers convenience.

The Council determined that the benches in the playing fields are appropriately located to take advantage of the views across the playing fields on completion of the current work.

Recent anti-social graffiti around the village has been removed & cleaned up.

Refresher training for the residents supporting the village defibrillator facility is available. Thank you to those who offer their time for this valuable resource.

We have three new volunteers for the Speed Watch Team, which is excellent news. Many thanks to those supporting this initiative. Please get in touch, via the clerk, if you are able to offer a few hours to join them.

The over-growth along Homberg Way footpath and cycleway has been noted. WPC do not have direct authority to cut this but are communicating with the relevant authorities to improve it.

Residents are politely requested not to throw garden vegetation over their boundary fences / hedges where they border a footpath please!

The Cottage Inn

As many of you will no doubt be aware, our only village pub, The Cottage Inn has been put up for sale by owners Wadworths Brewery. The present landlady Chrissie Melhuish is due to leave in early November. On Monday August 17th the Parish Council called an emergency meeting, held at the Parish Centre, to discuss whether to proceed with an application to have the pub listed as an Asset of Community Value. The meeting, which was attended by a large number of parishioners, voted overwhelmingly to pursue this course of action by submitting an application to Sedgemoor District Council. The outcome is not known at the time of writing this article, so please see local press for the outcome. Full details of what might be involved, should the Council be successful in their bid, can best be found online at various sources by searching for "Community Rights and the Localism Act."

The Parish Council will keep a very close watch on future proceedings, in an effort to ensure the village keeps and supports The Cottage Inn. We would take this opportunity to thank Chrissie for her efforts during the past 4 years and wish her every success and happiness for the future.

Wembdon Community 'Give-a-Day' October 3rd 2015.

After another successful day on Saturday 27th June it is time to prepare for the next session on our new Parish land. About 22 adults and a handful of youngsters attended in June and it was brilliant to see a number of new faces offering their help. We have almost finished the first field nearest to Oak Apple Drive and we anticipate moving nearer to the new Village Hall next.

A number of regular helpers are a little disappointed to have to wait 3 months between each work day and would like to initiate a once a month schedule. SO, I would like to suggest that after our next 'Give-a-Day' on Oct 3rd we meet on the first Sat of each month starting in November. This gives us: - Nov 7th & Dec 6th

We would appreciate help from anyone in the village who cares about Wembdon and who is available to give a couple of hours or so to help develop and improve a large area of 'scrub' land that has been untouched for about 25 yrs. If you walk down the Wares Lane footpath, it is the land to the left and right of the path as you approach Homberg Way. The work is hard, as it involves cutting long, thick brambles and overgrown copses of trees and shrubs. But it is great fun and an ideal way to meet like-minded people from the village. Any tools for cutting and any strimmers are a real help and you will need to wear old clothes and bring strong gloves.


ADOPT A FOOTPATH IN WEMBDON.

Somerset County Council are putting forward this scheme to encourage parishioners to 'adopt' a footpath in their Parish and to then give some free time to maintain the path. As footpath liaison officer for Wembdon, I was a little apprehensive about this scheme as it seems that SCC is passing on its responsibility for the upkeep of footpaths in Somerset. However, I am an optimist, not a cynic, and I can see some good coming out of this. There is already a small team of adults who have adopted the Wares Lane footpath and have been overseeing massive improvements over the last 6 months. They can be seen cutting, weeding and generally organising the clearing of this footpath 2 or more times per week and the improvement is nothing short of astonishing. They enjoy their collective input and appreciate the positive comments from all who regularly use that footpath. Could it spread to other footpaths in our Parish – WHY NOT!!! I have included a footpath map of Wembdon and am asking for anyone interested in 'adopting' one of our footpaths to get in touch with me so that I can co-ordinate our Parish response. How exciting is that??

Any downsides? I met one of the helpers in Wares Lane today (11th Aug) and she was distraught that garden rubbish had been tipped over an 8ft fence onto the footpath from residents in Oak Apple Drive. I am shocked that anyone would do this and would ask that it stops immediately.

Let's take up the challenge and help make our Parish footpaths lovely places to walk. Neil Harrison.

Dear Resident

Improving the Roundabout at Sandford Hill

We installed a new roundabout on the A39 in 2014 to replace a sharp bend where accidents occurred. The roundabout has made this section of the A39 safer.

The roundabout has worn in a way that wasn't envisaged and needs to be altered to install new, more prominent kerbs, to make it even safer.

We plan to start in mid-September and expect the work will take 4 weeks to complete.

To maintain safety whilst the work is underway two way traffic lights will be in operation on the A39 and Sandford Hill road and Charlynch lane will be closed where they join the roundabout. Access to properties will be maintained.

We've worked hard with Somerset County Council on a solution that will last and have planned the work in a way that keeps restrictions to a minimum.

Aggregate Industries will be undertaking the work on our behalf. Standard working hours are 07:30-18:30 Monday–Friday, but there may be some activity on Saturdays and outside of these hours.

Attached to this letter is a map that explains the planned traffic restrictions. We're sorry for inconvenience this work may cause.





Why is this work necessary when the new roundabout is only a year old? It is standard practice that when road improvements are made they have a 12 month warranty period to enable them to be 'road tested', before the Highway Authority adopts the new infrastructure. EDF Energy are enhancing the roundabout as part of the warranty. The new roundabout is already making the road safer. EDF Energy and SCC have worked together on the enhancements.


Who is responsible for the design and was it wrong? EDF Energy are responsible for the new roundabout as part of a £16 million package of road improvements that will become operational before main construction begins for Hinkley Point C. EDF Energy contracted independent, professional design consultants, White Young Green, who produced a design that conformed with national and local standards and was accepted by the Highway Authority. The enhancements that are planned will ensure the roundabout continues to be a major safety improvement for this part of theA39.

Local history - as recounted by a Wembdon resident:

50 YEARS AGO!

In 1965 fifty years ago some members of Wembdon's Ladies' Group helped to establish the Wembdon Playgroup which opened on November 16th 1965 in the old church hall on Orchard Lane.

The secretary was Mrs. Doris Turner who lived next door to the hall at 1, Vicars Lane. Her husband used to help to get the room ready and help to put away at the end of the morning. The chairman was June Napthine who lived in one of the large houses on Wembdon Rise and the supervisor was Meg Hanney from Church Road.

The children of many families in Wembdon and nearby attended. Those in the very early days included Anne and Ian Harding, Sarah Hankinson, Michael James, Tracey Homer, Jill Pemberton, Michael Tongue and Ian Bartlett. Mrs. Beryl Tasker joined the playgroup as supervisor a few months later.

Before long Wembdon Playgroup was open for five mornings a week.

Later Pam Woodley became supervisor for a number of years. The playgroup held Christmas Parties, Jumble Sales, fashion shows and many other fund raising activities.

The playgroup cleared the small space outside the hall between the hall and the Turner's house to use as an outside area-not very big or convenient.

Wembdon Playgroup moved from Orchard Lane hall, now demolished, to the Parish Centre after it was opened by Wembdon Church in 1993.

Later Wembdon Playgroup became Wembdon Sunshiners who now celebrate 50 years of using St. George's premises on 16th November 2015. They were the first playgroup in the area followed shortly afterwards by Cannington.
