#### News in brief:

The Village Hall was formally opened with an official ceremony, followed by a village day opening which was enjoyed and attended by local residents and neighbouring visitors, enjoying cream teas, children's activities and culminating in a family bar-b-q.

The SID purchased by the parish council is now operational in 3 designated areas around the village, with more to be established. Parish Councillors are working with residents to collate and process the data which has already highlighted the volume of traffic speeding through the village. The police have reacted with additional speed monitoring patrols and locations.

We were all delighted to see the new zebra crossing installed and functional in time for the new school year. WPC has actively supported this project for many years.

The Public Space Protection Order has been granted for a designated section of Wembdon Parklands which requires dogs to be kept on leads in these areas. SDC will install the appropriate signage shortly.

The Environmental Agency provided a detailed presentation regarding the Bridgwater Tidal Barrier scheme. Details can be found on the Sedgemoor District Council website.

A notice board (no longer compliant with the requirements of Parish Council notices) has been relocated to the allotments for their use. Good to see up-cycling in action!

The Parish Council wish to extend heartfelt thanks and appreciation to Wembdon Community Association for organising another fantastic Village Day; enjoyed by many, both local and from further afield with fabulous exhibits, stalls and entertainments, alongside the ever popular car boot sale. Looking forward, please support the Fireworks display.

Parish Council meetings are now being held in the Village Hall on the second Monday of the month – although this may be subject to change. Everyone is welcome.

Introductions, a summary of the project and a vote of thanks for all the funders including S.Notaro, the Trustees, the Project Team and their wives and partners was given by Mike Solomon, Chairman Wembdon Parish Council. Opening addresses were then made by Kerry Rickards, Chief Executive SDC; Ian Liddell-Grainger MP; Peter Renshaw, Chairman Viridor Credits; and Lyn Tyrrell, Trustee and Hall Manager.

The ceremonies were followed by a tour of the facilities when all the guests took the opportunity to have a good look around. The overwhelming view was that Wembdon was now provided with one of the very best village halls, positioned as it is with spectacular views over the new Village Green, with the rebuilt Parish Centre and our Parish Church as the backdrop, providing indoor and outdoor facilities for all ages in





the very centre of our village.



#### HIGHWAYS AND SPEEDWATCH.

Wembdon's <u>Speed Indicator Device</u> (SID) has been in operation now for 4 months. Locations have been selected according to known speeding hot-spots and the availability of posts – 2 more posts are due by Christmas!

We have used 3 locations so far:

**Wembdon Hill** - downhill towards the shop - 2,800 violations of more than 30 mph in 11 days. The fastest speed recorded was 60 mph;

**Church Rd** – towards the park & church - the SID was in place for 16 days and 4,774 exceeded 20 mph; the fastest recorded speed was 45 mph;

**Top of Wembdon Hill, by Skimmerton Lane -** entering the Village - the latest 'speeder' count, in 15 days, 4,767 vehicles going more than 30 mph.

The good news is that at the start of placement on Wembdon Hill 25.2% of vehicles were over the speed limit, but by the end 14.2 % a reduction of 11%.

In Church Rd at the start 45.6% of vehicles were breaking the 20-mph limit but by the end the figure was 23.5% a reduction of 20%!

Data seems to show that constantly being reminded of the Speed Limit- and the warning sign to **SLOW DOWN** – has a positive impact on driver behaviour.

This Data has been passed to the police speed enforcement team, who we are meeting with on October 2<sup>nd</sup> so they can witness the problem first-hand. We expect, as a minimum, the placement of the police motorcycle speed enforcement team, at regular intervals, to catch drivers responsible for making Wembdon roads a danger to all of us. Other good news is the 30 mph "Gateway" to the village has been moved further back towards Cannington. The hope is that traffic will slow down sooner!

Finally, the installation of the long-awaited Zebra Crossing in Wembdon Rise has, we hope, made it much safer to cross the road and forced drivers to slow down in that area of the village.

Grateful thanks to John Robins, Pete Prole & Dave Gliddon for their support in getting the SID operational. There is a chance the Speed Watch Team could re-start, but we do need more volunteers to be trained up. Many of you feel strongly about the village being used as a rat run, so please put your name forward and join us.

#### Shocking & mindless vandalism of the children's play area, Wembdon Park.











Sadly residents recently woke up to this appauling and offensive vandalism of our childrens play area – many images are too offensive to re-produce. Thanks to the swift and heroic efforts of a group of locals armed with cleaning products, plenty of elbow grease, goodwill and community spirit, the damage was minimised and the play area restored for the children to use before too many folk were exposed to its content. WPC has liaised closely with the Police and local PCSO's and are advised the culprits have been identified and are now undergoing a commuity resolution intervention including paying for the cleaning materials, cleaning the remaining graffiti, and some community pay-back hours to make a positive contribution to the area. We were all shocked by these events, and WPC wishes to extend grateful thanks to all those who helped with the clean up, and our PCSO's for acting so swiftly to support our community and respond to this anti-social behaviour.

#### **DOG WALKING**

At the end of September the Bridgwater Mercury printed an article about a new policy that is being introduced by Sedgemoor District Council. The policy will cover many areas including people who drink alcohol and use drugs in public spaces. It also sets out the SDC plans for the walking of dogs in public places. SDC were meeting in early October to accept this new policy.

Our Parish Council has outlined its plans for the whole area of The Green at Wembdon and we would like to thank everyone who has supported these plans by keeping your dog(s) on a lead when walking on the sports fields and children's park. The Parkland area is getting better and better as the grass is being cut shorter and more regularly and we are delighted to see more dogs off lead in this area. SDC has included all our plans for on lead and off lead areas in its new policy and this will be active very soon.

The SDC Dog Warden has been in contact with the PC to begin plans to patrol our park and we look forward to working together.



#### Wembdon Village Day.

After several years battling with a variety of weather conditions, the members of the Wembdon Community Association (WCA) were praying that this year's August Bank Holiday Monday weather would be dry to allow them to raise funds needed to support village organisations and projects throughout the coming year, especially with new facilities available at the Parish Centre and the Village Hall. They were not disappointed on a day that turned out to be one of the warmest this year. We were blessed with glorious sunshine all through the day, so the first car-booters were waiting to enter the field at 6am, just as the organisers were setting up the stalls on the Common! An estimated 3000 people came to enjoy the many attractions, including a well-attended Car Boot Sale, a Craft Show at the new Village Hall, Bar, BBQ and stalls run by local clubs and charities, as well as fête favourites such as a coconut shy, hook-a-duck and smash the crockery. The annual Fruit, Vegetable, Flower and Craft Show in the Parish Centre had several new exhibitors, especially in the children's classes, and, as ever, the quality of entries was exceedingly high. The Scarecrow Competition was run for the 2nd year running, with several entries appearing across the Village to the shock of the local seagulls! This year the judges awarded the Best Exhibit trophy to Mrs Margaret Hawkings for her painting of sweet peas, and to Miss Bethany Moss for her illustrated poem entitled "One More Step Along The Road I Go". Many of the exhibitors donated their entries after the show to be auctioned off and Ian Dyer as auctioneer did a fantastic job persuading people to part with their money. The facilities at the newly refurbished Parish Centre were also enjoyed by those visiting for refreshments and they were treated to amazing performances from Burtle Silver Band, while enjoying delicious sandwiches, cakes and cream teas prepared and served by members of the Wembdon community. The new Village Hall was home to a Craft Show and the bar, which attracted many visitors from further afield, as well as members of the local community. The new sports field hosted many more attractions including the annual Children's Races which also saw participation from some of the "adult children", requiring them to perform push-ups, before racing to collect cones placed along the course! All in all a very successful event made possible by the hard work and dedication of the Wembdon Community Association with an enormous amount of help and support from the local community, without which the staging of an event of this magnitude would be impossible. With this year's very successful Village Day behind us, members of the WCA are now looking forward to our next major event: the spectacular Annual Firework Display at Blake's Field (by the church), on Saturday 28th October 2017 at 6.45 p.m. This is a professionally-fired display by "Skyburst", and we look forward to seeing you there! 
#### GIVE-AN-HOUR (or two).

#### Wembdon St George's Primary School.

The 1st September was the official conversion date for Wembdon St George's to become a Bath and Wells Multi-Academy Trust School. A great deal of support is being offered with a focussed and strategic action plan in place and there has been a rapid period of change which has included getting to grips with new administrative systems, changes to teaching and learning and the school environment but all with one focus - improvement for our children. Every area of the school is in the process of being sorted, cleaned and reorganised. Any old, broken, out of date equipment and materials are being recycled in order that we have a school fit for purpose with only good quality, up-to- date resources for staff and children – you may have seen the large skip outside school. Other changes have included separating K\$1 and K\$2 at break times which has created safer and calmer playtimes with a huge reduction in first aid incidents. We now have an Early Bird Activity where children can come straight into the classrooms in the morning which has resulted in a much more positive and calmer start to the school day; it has also improved parking in terms of parents dropping their children off in the morning. I am pleased to see that Highways have been a visible presence again outside school at the end of the

Our new reception children are now in school fulltime and our Year 6 pupils have just returned from a week in Shropshire at an Outdoor Adventure Centre – a great teambuilding opportunity and the children learnt some very new and exciting skills. Our Harvest Festival will be celebrated in church and this year and the school is again supporting our local foodbank. Our Christian value this term is Trust and we are inviting parents and grandparents into school when their child's class is leading collective worship. Our Year 4 have started swimming lessons at 1610, multi-skills clubs before and after school are proving popular and it is lovely to welcome back our peripatetic music staff after the summer break.

Safeguarding is always high on our agenda and we are having some new fencing fitted around the school site. We have also reviewed and tightened access to our site and that of Dragonflies, our breakfast and after school club, with school gates only being opened for short periods at the start and end of the school day. All access is now through the main entrance.



Summer 2017 has been an incredibly busy first summer on The Green. Wembdon Cricket Club came back to the village for the first time in more than 50 years. The Sunday XI won their division and the Ladies side were victorious in the inaugural Storm Festival which we hosted. The 4 Saturday sides all finished in the top 4 positions. Our junior cricket nights were well attended with more than 100 young boys and girls making full use of the superb facilities. Wembdon Risers rounder's team could be found every other Tuesday on The Green in the summer having played for many years outside the parish. During the summer we also hosted Primary School cricket and rounder's festivals for SASP. We hosted an Under 11 District cricket festival for the Somerset Cricket Board. The regional finals for the Last Man Stands franchise. We also hosted touring sides from the midlands and London and are busy planning an even bigger programme for 2018. Since the final game at the beginning of September both cricket squares have been top dressed and fresh grass seed is busy germinating. The height of the grass has been raised ready for the football season and 6 pitches are now marked out for Wembdon Football Club. The top corner of playing field near Wembdon Motors has recently been turfed and we are all delighted with how well the playing fields now look. In the coming weeks the fields will receive an autumn weed and feed plus they will get verti-drained to help keep the pitches in top condition and drainage functioning affectively.
