Wembdon Parish Council unveils new 'Access for All' playground equipment

Wembdon leads the way

As a key element of the Wembdon Parish Council 'Access for All' programme, The Council have worked closely with the Wembdon Village Hall & Playing Field Trust and the Big Lottery to provide fully accessible 'Changing Places' toilet facilities in the Village Hall. This has now been completed and is the first such facility to be installed in Sedgemoor and only the third in Somerset. It is also the first installation of its kind in an outdoor sports and recreation centre.

The need for such facilities was identified when a Wembdon resident highlighted that whilst the disabled facilities in the new village hall were to a recognized DDA standard, when the need was for facilities for people with more serious impairments who need motorized lifting equipment and changing tables, the hall was unable to meet their needs. This meant that when she and her husband took her two children to the park or to an event at the hall, should one of her children, who is profoundly disabled, need to use the toilet, then she had to return home and that was then the end of the day out for the whole family.

The Parish Council learned that Wembdon has a number of people in the parish and the local area who would benefit from the facilities and so the Parish Council contacted the Big Lottery and started to seek grants not only for the "**Changing Places**" facilities but also for new and very specialized play equipment for the park and this equipment really had to be accessible to every child.



The Big Lottery fully shared our vision of providing facilities that were truly 'Accessible to All'. In addition to the Changing Places facilities, they have now funded a new trampoline and roundabout, both specially designed and fabricated to be strong enough to handle the additional weight of a motorized wheelchair. Regular disabled play equipment will handle loads of 100kg, but the motorized wheelchairs need more than twice that capacity so stronger bearings and additional and stronger springs have been included in this new leading-edge design. The Parish Council have been working closely with the families and the manufacturer, G L Jones, who specialize in children's play equipment, to ensure that the play equipment is fun to use, fully accessible and safe for everybody.

These two projects to provide '**Changing Places**' facilities and fully accessible play equipment are a part of the Parish Council's 'Access for All' programme, which has a clear vision to ensure that every person in our community can access the very best facilities, be it the village hall, the sports fields, the green spaces or the play equipment. The Access for All project has included: providing new and tarmac surfaced footpaths, new tarmac surface to the village hall car park, **Changing Places** facilities, new and additional play equipment, new solar powered pathway lighting and all covered by an extensive CCTV system, which is being supported jointly by the village hall and Parish Council and funded by The Big Lottery plus RLT2 and RLT3 grants from Sedgemoor District Council.



NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE

The Neighbourhood Plan for Wembdon is nearing its final stages, as I am sure many of you will be pleased to hear. It is currently undergoing the process of examination by Sedgemoor District council and after that will be subjected to scrutiny by an external examiner. We are hopeful that this process will be straightforward, and not lead to any delay. The next stage will be the referendum, after which the plan will be formally adopted (if the result is positive). We hope that the residents will vote, and vote in favour of the plan.

As a brief reminder and to extract directly from the District Council (SDC) summary, our plan has the following objectives for Wembdon:

- 1. Ensure that new development reflects and contributes positively to the rural and green character of Wembdon;
- Support the continued delivery of a comprehensive, forward-looking community strategy with facilities that are complementary to each other and provide access for all;
- Promote cohesion and integration of new communities, and particularly those at Cokerhurst Farm within the Neighbourhood Development Plan area;
- 4. Secure funding for local infrastructure to support the delivery of growth;
- 5. Encourage a reduction in traffic speeds, volumes and congestion to improve highway safety and in turn promote sustainable, appropriate travel patterns which reflect the local context;
- 6. Deliver affordable and other types of housing principally for local people.

The plan is based upon the feedback from surveys of every household and school. There have been multiple stages of consultation and the final draft, prepared just before Christmas, has been approved by SDC as meeting all European, as well as local, regulations. This final consultation ended 15th February and any editing completed before the plan goes to an Inspector appointed by SDC. The examination and hearings are scheduled to take until the end of May and we anticipate a referendum in early June. Hopefully the plan will be supported by all residents of our parish and will then become a part of the planning framework against which new applications are assessed.

REPORT FROM THE SPEEDWATCH TEAM



Latest evidence from the Speed Indicator Device:

<u>Church Rd</u> – AVERAGE SPEED is 15.7 mph in the 20-mph zone BUT we recorded a vehicle driving at 35 mph towards the park entrance on 11/01/19 at 19:35.

<u>Wembdon Rise</u> - AVERAGE SPEED is 26.1 mph in the 30-mph zone BUT we recorded a vehicle travelling at 60.0 mph on 09/12/2018 at 11:25 a.m. and regularly vehicles are travelling in excess of 50 mph toward the zebra crossing.

<u>Wembdon Hill</u> – AVERAGE SPEED is 24 mph in the 30-mph zone BUT we recorded a vehicle travelling at 60.0 MPH on 30/12/2018 at 21:35 and others in excess of 55 mph!

Most worryingly we are getting regular reports of near misses on the <u>zebra</u> <u>crossing</u>. The Parish Council is aware of this and have continued contact with Highways over our concerns. Instances of vehicles overtaking cars that have stopped to let a pedestrian cross are very worrying and we aim to look for solutions to this issue.

The **SPEEDWATCH** team have been out on Wembdon Hill and Wembdon Rise, recording offenders' details and sending them to the Police Speed Enforcement Team. *Please give us a friendly wave in our efforts to keep you the residents of Wembdon, safe from speeding traffic.*


