WEMBDON FIREWORKS DISPLAY

On Saturday 26th October the community came together in great numbers to support the Annual Fireworks Display in the "Auction Field" on Blakes Road.

Throughout the rainy afternoon a dedicated and soggy team of WCA members along with a professional team from Skyburst Fireworks defied the weather to prepare for the event on the promise of an improving forecast leading into the evening. Although very wet by the end of the afternoon, unlike the Bridgwater event planned for the following week, we were rewarded as the rain stopped and the wind eased and turned to a favourable direction for the display to continue.

What a fantastic ground and aerial display we were treated to. Skyburst pulled out all of the stops to treat us to a spectacular show. Judging by the departing comments on the gate as the spectators of all ages left the field it was thoroughly enjoyed by all and the general consensus being that "we'll be back next year".

There has been a great deal of opposition towards Fireworks for many reasons but, despite the rising costs the WCA are dedicated towards the future of this event. We don't set out to make a profit but endeavour to cover as many of the costs as possible via entrance fees and refreshments. If it continues to entertain the community at low cost to them, this professionally fired display negates the need for many random displays within densely populated back gardens and may even avoid serious injury to children or family members. Skyburst are a highly professional company who stage displays across the country and are always very favourable towards our event. We always have a St John Ambulance team and the local police on site, inform the Fire Brigade and even Air Traffic Control so we just need the continued support of the Wembdon Community and a bit of luck with the weather. Next year being a leap year, the event will take place on Saturday 31st October 2020.

Hello, I am Dianne Claydon. I have recently joined the Parish Council and have a liaison role for the allotments.



I have lived in Wembdon for 28 years, and worked in education for all my working life, the majority of it at Bridgwater College. As a keen gardener I dreamed of having an allotment in my

retirement, and put my name down on the waiting list. Ten years ago my name came to the top of the list and I took over a plot needing quite a bit of attention, but was handsomely rewarded by an ample supply of cooking apples, damsons and plums plus my own organic vegetables. My husband says there is time and allotment time. The Wembdon Hill allotments are in such a lovely spot looking towards the estuary, observing the wildlife is such a pleasure. One of my favourite places in the village. Time does stand still sometimes.

The Parish Council bought the allotments 9 years ago and invested to improve the track, water troughs, fencing, seating, litter bins and most recently rebuilding the wall which collapsed last winter. This is not only appreciated by allotment holders but, I am sure, also by dog walkers and walkers. When I was asked to consider being a councillor to take over from Neil Harrison, who had stepped down as councillor, it was seeing how the Parish Council had improved the village in so many ways that influenced my decision to be put forward for co-option onto the Council. I thought it time to contribute to the village. Unsurprisingly therefore, my liaison role is for the allotments, something I value dearly.

- Average Speed: 26.7MPH

In August when the SID was in the same location, it recorded a daily average of 878 vehicles per day passing through, in November it was 814.

The average speed in August was 28.1 MPH, in November it was 26.7MPH.

The highest recorded speed in August was 55 MPH, in November it was 60MPH.

The extraordinary wet weather conditions!

It has been very challenging for the PACT team, our helpers, contractors and the landscaping team to work, due to the excessive rainfall. Despite this, everyone has persevered and made good use of their time when there have been dry days.

We would like to take this opportunity to apologise for all the mud and tyre tracks, which have been unavoidable, due to the saturated ground conditions, and to thank everyone for your patience and words of encouragement. Please be reassured, the team will be making this good by scraping the tracks flat now and levelling and re-seeding in the spring.

What's been achieved so far:

- All the pathways have been completed and people of all abilities are using them.
- The fencing has been installed along the entrance to Oak Apple Drive, and the yellow self-closing gate works well and is easily seen in the dark.
- We have been granted planning permission for the 4 solar lights and the 2 CCTV cameras. The solar lights have been ordered and we are awaiting a date for fitting them.
- The magnificent mature trees have all been planted bar one, Lucie New is in the process of sourcing a mature red oak as a feature tree. This will be positioned opposite the NDR bridge entrance and donated by the Wembdon PACT team, as a part of the celebrations for the 75th anniversary of VE day, on the 8th May 2020.
- Planting of the prairie meadow and orchard has been completed. The prairie plants are mostly perennials and will be popping back up to attract insects every year.
- The sensory borders are taking shape and the oak raised bed seats are being planted. The wood will age and turn a silvery

colour blending into its surroundings, surrounded by sensory plants.

- The educational nature trail wooden animal sculptures are on order and will be concealed in the greenery, for children to find and learn about the wildlife living in the local area.
- S. Roberts & Son, have kindly donated the tree stumps, needed to build the stumpery feature area. We are recycling the logs that are laying on the ground nearby within the stumpery. Some wooden post and bar fencing will be recycled and installed behind this area, allowing the badgers and foxes to enter the parklands from Oak Apple Drive but preventing vehicular access.
- The trustees have been planting approximately 200 spring bulbs under the triangular copse opposite the sensory borders. Fingers crossed we will see them in the spring.
- A big thank you to the volunteers from the Wembdon Give a Day team, who have been tidying up and planting bulbs under other trees around the nature walk.

Soon Lucie's team will begin planting the sensory borders and begin work on the stumpery. We are very pleased with the progress of the project and how it is coming together. We are receiving fabulous feedback from people as they walk through the area, which is very rewarding for all those working hard on the project.

The team would like to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New. Best wishes from the Wembdon PACT Team.

For many, the start of a new year brings an opportunity for reflection, fresh starts and change - but could you change a child's story this year?

For over 500 children in Somerset, spending time at home isn't possible right now, which is why we urgently need more foster carers to offer safe, loving homes to our children in care. Foster carers can make a real difference to children's lives. They help them through tough times and give them the support they need to achieve their full potential.

Fostering is not a one size fits all. There are a variety of different avenues within fostering to match the vast and sometimes complex needs of the children in our care, and the lifestyles of our carers; from the dedication of long term fostering over a period of years, to the flexibility of respite providing care just one weekend a month. In return our carers receive ongoing support and training, a dedicated social worker and a weekly fee and allowance (amounts vary – please speak to our team or visit the website for details).

If you're aged 21 or over and have a spare room, along with the time and patience to support a Somerset child in care, visit fosteringinsomerset.org.uk or call our team on 0800 587 9900 to find out how you could help change a child's story. There is no upper age limit, and things like your gender, sexual preference or marital status are not important – you just need the right qualities and mindset. Alternatively, come along to our next information evening and find out more about fostering over a coffee and cake.
