Firstly, please let me introduce myself. I am Tony Jay, and I have been your Parish Council Clerk since 2014. I thoroughly enjoy the work, especially as it gives me the chance to help the parishioners of Wembdon with their problems. I am also clerk for Wraxall and Failand Parish Clerk, so I am a busy chap! I will be writing a piece in each edition of the Parish Paper. I hope that you find my jottings interesting.

Councillor Anne Reed and I have taken on the role of joint editors of the Parish Paper. This is because the previous editor, Cllr. Jodene Hall, has moved from Wembdon and retired from the Council. I wish to express my thanks to Jodene, and her predecessor Jo Jackson, for all their work in editing the magazine.

I regularly receive complaints from parishioners about two problems. The problem of speeding vehicles is covered in the Speed Watch article, but I will speak about the other. This is dogs running off lead on Wembdon Green. There are clear notices saying that dogs must be on a lead, but a hard core of dog owners continue to ignore this. The Sedgemoor DC dog wardens visit the area and issue fixed penalty tickets, but the message still doesn't get through to some. It is harder to supervise a dog if it is off a lead, which often leads to poo not being picked up. This is not only anti-social, but it can cause blindness in children. If this is you, then please use a lead at all times on the Green.

COVID testing in Village Hall car park



Since Wednesday 25th August Wembdon Village Hall has been hosting a drive-through COVID-19 test centre in the car park. This has been supplemented occasionally by a mobile processing unit, or mobile lab. The lab, one of only three in

the country allows samples to be processed much faster than usual, delivering results within three hours. The new testing site is available to those with Covid-19 symptoms

– a high temperature, a new continuous cough, or a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste. Anyone with one or more of these symptoms can get a test at the site, by booking at nhs.uk/coronavirus or



calling 119. Booking is essential. The site will operate from 9.00 am to 3.30 pm five days a week and will be in place for at least the next few months. A spokesperson for the Wembdon Village Hall & Playing Fields Trust said: “We are so pleased to be able to help out in this way, without impacting the other services and events we provide to our community. We’re sure this will prove to be a useful and efficient facility at a time when we are sadly seeing high Covid-19 case rates locally. The test centre replaces the one in Bridgwater Town Hall, which closed in August”.

Our new website



The Wembdon Parish Council website had not been updated for a number of years and was looking rather tired. We also had to make sure we complied with the Government's new accessibility regulations, and we needed to be able to quickly and easily put in place the national protocol following the death of a senior member of the royal family. (Which happened much sooner than we had hoped, with the death of HRH The Duke of Edinburgh in March 2021.) We wanted a clean, modern-looking website, useable on all devices, as we recognise that many people now access the web using their phones and tablets, rather than laptops and desktops.

Accessibility



The websites of all public organisations have to be accessible, according to the Government's regulations. That means that they should be useable by people with limited vision, or with limited mobility.

We want as many people as possible to be able to use our website. For example, that means you should be able to:

- change colours, contrast levels and fonts
- zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen
- navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- navigate most of the website using speech recognition software
- listen to most of the website using a screen reader (including the most recent versions of JAWS, NVDA and VoiceOver)

You can find the tools to change colours, contrast levels, fonts and zoom by clicking the  icon on the left of the screen near the top.

We've also made the website text as simple as possible to understand. AbilityNet (<https://mcmw.abilitynet.org.uk>) has advice on making your device easier to use if you have a disability. We ask that anybody who has a problem using our site should contact the Parish Clerk (clerk@wembdon.org).

In September 2019 a small working group of Councillors and the Parish Clerk started work on possible designs. We looked at a range of Parish Council websites, which gave us a shortlist of potential suppliers. Based on responses received to a questionnaire, and on an interview, we chose a local company to design our site. Work started in June 2020, but was hampered by the COVID restrictions preventing face-to-face meetings. The new site finally went live in June 2021, and we are very pleased with it, as we hope you are.

The fence between it and the playground has been removed and it is now a beautiful place for children to let their imaginations run loose and enjoy it all year around. The school have recently subscribed to being an Opal Playground school with the vision that every child has an amazing playtime every day. The importance for creating and resourcing a great place for them to enjoy being children, is the knowledge that happy children are healthier, learn better, display more emotional literacy, and behave better.

This is the fifth academic year the school has been part of the Bath & Wells Multi Academy Trust and we continue to establish strong links between the church and community. As a lover of the outdoors and from a country upbringing I find Wembdon retains that rural and village feel, in spite of being intrinsically connected with the wider town and the ever encroaching development activities. I particularly like the fact that it takes less than a 5 minute walk/run before I can be in the fields with opportunities to explore the wider parish across the fields towards the River Parrett, Chilton Trinity, Cannington and beyond.

Being new to the Council there will be a learning process I'm sure, but I look forward to supporting the established and committed Parish Council in their endeavours going forward.

Parklands News!

Sunshine and Showers

A summer of shine and showers produced a beautiful display of purple Verbena and the yellow daisy like heads of Rudbeckia on the sensory borders. Attracting all sorts of wildlife including frogs, toads, newts, honeybees, ladybirds, dragonflies, and butterflies. New funding has allowed us to re-plan and plant a framework of evergreens that will provide year-round interest and become a complimentary support to seasonal bulbs, grasses, and perennials. A bark topping will be laid on the borders as a mulch and weed barrier, temporary orange fencing has been installed, intended to protect, and allow the plants to bed in and establish themselves.

We have seen a big increase in wildlife this year and many of you have told us about your encounters. There has been evidence of badgers that are using the hedgerow tunnels, we have found diggings at the Parklands at the bottom of Wares Lane. A resident of Wares Lane told us they regularly see two badgers walking along the pathways. The foxes are living in the thick hedge which is always full of birds singing. A family of squirrels have moved in, hazel nut shells are scattered, and

we saw the mother carrying her kitten. There are many frogs, toads, and on all areas, they are enjoying the borders where they can find slugs to eat. We have found slow worms near the insect hotels where their food source is in abundance.

Hidden around the park are places where animals can come and go to the rhine, where there have been sightings of herons, egrets, and moorhens. If you stand quietly and watch then you will see the herons catching fish. We can clearly see that all our work is paying off and the wildlife are thriving, so many people talk to us about the wildlife they see and the benefits the area has made to their health and wellbeing.

CCTV installation is underway in the Parklands and will hopefully make people walking in the park feel a bit safer on these drawing in nights, and will help to protect the trees, plants and parkland furniture from damage. It may even help us to have a better idea of what nocturnal animal movements are occurring around the parklands. You will also notice that during the last wet period the footpaths are no longer flooding making it safer to walk in the rain, thanks to the drainage that



we installed at the same time as working on CCTV installation. A new set of steps are currently being installed on the slippery bank which leads to the dog exercising field. These will make walking down the bank much safer for all pedestrians.

We garden on Sunday mornings between 10am and 1pm, weather permitting. We welcome **Parkland Friends** to volunteer, come along and spend a couple of hours to help with weeding and planting. If you are interested in joining the group, please call Lorna on 07917101990.

WEMBDON SPEED WATCH

“What are the Parish Council doing about the traffic speeds in Wembdon?”

It’s a question constantly asked of us and probably the hardest to solve.

However, we are very proactive and striving for a number of things to get drivers to slow down and keep our residents safe.

SO WHAT HAVE WE DONE?

1. Put pressure on SCC to install a speed reducing cushion top on the zebra crossing to cause vehicles to slow down. Our Somerset County Councillor Mike Caswell is submitting a small improvements bid this autumn.
2. Installed permanent Speed Indicator Devices on Sandford Hill coming into the village & on Wembdon Rise. A new permanent SID will soon be in place just past Wares Lane towards the zebra crossing.



3. Moved our current Speed Indicator Device around other locations in the village on a regular basis. The Police have assured us these are effective and help reduce traffic speeds. Thanks are due to the team of

volunteers who manage this.

4. Monitored Speed Data to pass information to our District and County Councillors, as well as to the police speed enforcement unit. Here is the latest for all areas of Wembdon:

Wembdon Rise (inbound from NDR) Average speed 24.34 mph; top speed 64 mph

Wembdon Rise (outbound towards NDR) Average speed 24.13 mph; top speed 68 mph

Wembdon Hill (going up, westbound) Average speed 25.3 mph; top speed 50 mph

Wembdon Hill (going down, eastbound) *Average speed 25.3 mph; top speed 55 mph

Wembdon Hill (by Skimmerton Lane inbound) Average speed 25.9 mph; top speed 60 mph

Sandford Hill (inbound) Average speed 28.5 mph; top speed 67 mph

Sandford Hill (outbound) Average Speed 32.48 mph; top speed 89 mph

Church Rd (towards the church) Average speed 12.2 mph; top speed 40 mph

Church Rd (away from the church) Average speed *16.0 mph; top speed 40 mph

(Most of these average speeds have fallen over the past 12 months except for those marked *)

5. Used Speed Watch volunteers to catch and report speeding drivers to the police. We are incredibly grateful for the work of this team which operate at three risk- assessed, and police approved, sites in the village. Drivers caught speeding receive a letter from the police and in extreme cases will be visited at home by a police officer. COVID restrictions have eased, and the team will be operating more often. We ALL live on Wembdon Hill and KNOW there is still an issue with speeding traffic particularly early mornings and late afternoons.

Dan Cox from Avon & Somerset Police Road Safety Team visited the village at my request on September 29th: These are his comments:

“The SID is good where it is for your purpose – Sandford Hill. Stood in the village it was like Driving Miss Daisy with so many parked cars. The SID works well so that is a blessing. I will look at waking up a few drivers! They shouldn’t be going so fast from the roundabout.”

“It is all heading in the right direction.”

THANK YOU ALL FOR DRIVING CAREFULLY AND WITHIN THE SAFE SPEED LIMIT.


