# Parish Clerk's Notes



It has been a busy few weeks in the parish. Plans are underway for the Coronation celebrations in May. There is an article regarding these events later in this Parish Paper. We have a new Councillor, Chris Chalk who introduces himself later in this edition. The plans for the new Unitary Somerset Council are now at an advanced stage, with District Councils such as

Sedgemoor and Mendip disappearing at the end of March. The new Somerset Council will commence on 1<sup>st</sup> April. The Parish Council will join a Local Community Network of nearby Parish Councils. Wembdon's network will be named Dowsborough and will include sixteen Parish Councils in the electoral districts of Bridgwater West, Cannington and Watchet & Stogursey. For many months the Parish Councillors assumed that we would be in a Local Community Network with Bridgwater, but this will not be the case. This will be a major change in the way that Parish Councils operate. The Local Community Networks will hold meetings six to eight times a year and will comprise of many agencies and organisations including education, health, social services, and the police.

On a different note, the problem of dog mess continues to be a regular cause of concern to many residents. The Parish Council takes this problem seriously, which is illustrated by its provision of twenty one dog and litter bins which is a large number for a parish of our size. Bagged dog mess can be put in litter bins. The dog warden at Sedgemoor District Council has agreed to increase her patrols in Wembdon in order to catch and fine these irresponsible dog owners.

I hope that you all enjoy the Coronation celebrations in the parish.

### **Planning Matters**

One of the core functions of a Parish Council is to comment on planning applications. We have no decision making powers, but as a consultee Sedgemoor District Council (soon to be Somerset Council) must ask us for our opinions about all planning applications in the parish, which they must listen to although they often overrule what we have decided.

Wembdon has a Neighbourhood Plan which was adopted in 2019. The plan can be found on the Parish Council's website on the planning page or if you are viewing the online version of this Parish Paper then please click on this link. The Neighbourhood Plan contains a list of requirements that all planning applications in Wembdon should comply with. These include things like the construction materials to be used and the number of parking spaces if the application seeks to increase the number of bedrooms at the property. It is clear that many planning applicants aware of the requirements listed in the are not Neighbourhood Plan. It is common practice for applicants to use an agent to design and submit their planning application. These agents are often also unaware of the Wembdon Neighbourhood Plan. When Parish Council Planning Committee considers а application then they may consider opposing it if it does not comply with the requirements of the Neighbourhood Plan. If you are thinking about submitting a planning application, then you should consult the Neighbourhood Plan before you do so.



#### The Coronation Weekend.

# 6th - 8th May 2023

The Coronation Service of His Majesty King Charles III and the Queen Consort will occur on Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> May at Westminster Abbey. The ceremony will be shown around the world. It is an historic occasion full of religious ceremony, celebration and pageantry.



The Village Hall will be open on 6<sup>th</sup> of May for those who would like to share the occasion with others. The ceremony will be projected on to the Wall in the Main Hall to show the splendour and pageantry of the occasion. Teas and coffee and biscuits will be available.

# Sunday the 7<sup>th</sup> May is the day of the Coronation Big Lunch and the Coronation Concert.

The Coronation Big Lunch is an opportunity for neighbours and communities across the United Kingdom to share food and fun together, to bring celebrations into your neighbourhood and to get to know your neighbours better. It could be as simple as inviting neighbours around for a cup of tea and cake or to have a street party for your neighbourhood. The onus is on you.

The Coronation Concert will take place at Windsor Castle. It is a staged live broadcast produced by the BBC. It will bring global music icons and contemporary stars together in celebration of this historic occasion. The centrepiece of the Coronation Concert 'Lighting up the Nation', will see iconic locations across the United Kingdom lit up using projections, lasers, drone displays and illuminations.

The Village Hall will open its doors in the evening to show the Coronation Concert in the Main Hall on the wall. The Bar will be

open. There will be LIVE music at the Cottage Inn from the early evening onwards.

#### The Big Help Out will be held on Monday 8th May.

This will highlight the positive impact volunteering has on communities across the United Kingdom. In tribute to His Majesty the King's public service 'The Big Help Out' will encourage people to try volunteering for themselves and join the work being undertaken to support their local areas. The aim is to use volunteering to bring communities together and create a lasting legacy from the Coronation Weekend.

At St George's Parish Centre will be **Wembdon's Volunteer Fayre.** between 10 -12 on 8th May. It will showcase all the groups in Wembdon which are run by volunteers. You may be surprised how many organisations there are and just how they help and make our community. Stalls will be manned by each organisations plus various activities to join in with.

#### The Great Village Litter Pick.

There will be a Great Village Litter Pick. The Give A Day team will be building a planted area on the entrance to Wembdon by the traffic lights. Wembdon PACT will have an activity to join. All these and other great groups make your community a better place. They rely entirely on volunteers. It is hoped that this will inspire you to help out in the future. Tea, Coffee and Cakes will be available.

#### Commemorative Tree Planting on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> May.

An oak tree will be planted to mark the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III. A second oak tree will be planted in remembrance of Queen Elizabeth II.

If you aren't able to volunteer on a regular basis there will be an opportunity on the day to help with a litter pick around the village (starting in church car park), churchyard tidying and pond tidying.

And finally, don't forget the coffee shop is open on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. There is a Tea-time special on the first Tuesday afternoon of the month; along with a range of different clubs and activities throughout the week.

#### SPEED INDICATOR DEVICES REPORT

As reported in our last Parish Paper we await the introduction of the newly approved 20 mph speed limit in the village. SCC Highways have to alter all signage including new roundels on the road surface. Recent bad weather may delay this, but we hope that by the time you receive the next issue things will have progressed. Please can we ask that you act as a pace car when the new 20 mph limit is introduced. We know that some idiots will risk life and limb by overtaking you in crazy fashion, but if we can drive slowly this may deter some of the rat-runners from using us as a short cut. We are fully aware that this is just the next step in trying to slow traffic down coming in and out of Wembdon. I visited Cannington Parish Council recently to help them with their SID's and, despite now having raised full-width speed humps on Rodway, speeding is still an issue. Parked cars actually help to slow down traffic in Wembdon, making a natural chicane. Many of us park on the road on Wembdon Hill, Wembdon Rise & Church Road and this actually helps with reducing speeds. Four of your Parish Councillors live on the Hill & Rise so know full well what you are experiencing. Most high-end speeders are recorded in the early morning or late at night. This is not acceptable, but very difficult to police.




