Once again it has been a busy few months in the parish. The Coronation celebrations were a great success, despite the mixed weather. The parish councillors also said goodbye to Mike Solomon, who has stood down as a parish councillor. Both of these events are covered in greater detail in the next three pages. On a personal note, I would like to thank Mike for all the support he has given me as your parish clerk since I took over the role in

2014. I shall miss Mike, but I am already working very well with his successor as chairman, Anne Reed.

Fly parking by Hinkley workers continues to be a problem in the parish. All Hinkley employees must register their vehicle details with their employers and agree not to fly-park. Unfortunately, this is being ignored by some workers, with all parishes in the area suffering. The parish council is increasing its efforts to tackle dog mess. Councillor Chalk is taking the lead on this and has liaised with the primary school who are running a competition for pupils to design a poster. There is an article about this later in the parish paper.

As part of last year's Jubilee celebrations, the parish council planted oak trees to create a 'Queens Copse' in recognition of the reign of Elizabeth II. It saddens me to write that during the evening of Tuesday 30th May vandals have snapped two of these young trees in half. Our maintenance contractor is trying his best to save the trees, but if they need to be replaced then the cost to you, the taxpayer, will be around £500. Mike Solomon has stood down as a parish councillor after twenty years of unbroken service. For the last twelve years Mike has been parish council chairman. Examples include Wembdon allotments have been established, the Village Hall has been built, the Parklands has been created and fully accessible play equipment is now in the playground.

In recognition of Mike's service, the parish councillors decided to award Mike the 'Freedom of the Parish of Wembdon'. This is the highest honour that a parish council can bestow.

Coronation Celebrations in the Parish

Coronation Day, May 6th

The Village Hall opened for visitors at 10am, with the events in London showing on a large screen. A few parties came along, and decorated the tables. Teas and coffees were served, and the atmosphere was suitably festive, with many wearing "crowns". The Cottage Inn, looking very smart after its recent refurbishment, had a live band in the evening.

Sunday, May 7th

St George's Church Parish Centre hosted a bring your own Big Picnic Lunch, luckily the weather was kind and people were able to eat outside, in traditional "street party" style. The Village Hall and Bar were open for anyone wishing to watch the Windsor Park concert on a large screen. The Cottage had live bands playing during the afternoon and evening, with food served in the evening, these events were definitely popular.

Monday, May 8th

The Big Help Out was launched at St George's Parish Centre, with many turning out to help with litter picking, "seed bomb" making and planting. In spite of the wet weather 10 bags of litter were collected, and seeds planted. A coffee morning in the Parish Centre was well attended. Two new trees were planted by Councillor Mike Solomon, with the help of some children, one in memory of the late Queen, Elizabeth II, the second one in Parklands to commemorate the Coronation of King Charles III. Both are red oaks. Three large planters were placed at the Wembdon Rise/Homberg Way junction by the Wembdon Village sign, and planted up with colourful shrubs and bedding plants. A similar one has also been placed at the Sandford Cross entrance to the village. At 3pm the bells of St Georges Church rang out for 20 minutes, this included call changes called 'King'. Parishioner receives Royal Maundy Money

Katherine Cannell was one of seventy four women and seventy four men to have received a special thanks from His Majesty King Charles in recognition of their Christian service and for making a difference to the lives of people in her local community. Having been nominated by the Bishop of Bath and Wells she was invited by His Majesty to receive the Royal Maundy Money at York Minster on Maundy Thursday which was on 6 April 2023.

Katherine is presently Lay Dean of Sedgemoor Deanery and a lay member of Diocesan Synod, previously serving on Bishops Council and on the Vacancy in See Committee - for the appointment of Bishop Michael Beasley to Bath and Wells.

Commenting on the occasion, 'It was truly an amazing service. Very humbling and such a privilege to have been nominated'.

The distribution of alms by Kings and Queens of England on Maundy Thursday is an ancient ceremony that dates back to 600AD; seventy four men and seventy four women (signifying the age of the Monarch) are chosen for their service to the church and community and are nominated from across the dioceses of England, and Anglican and Ecumenical partners across the United Kingdom.

His Majesty King Charles III presented each recipient with two purses: one red and one white. A white purse containing sliver 1p,2p,3p and 4p coins equivalent in value to his age, which this year is 74p. The red purse, which contained a silver £5 coin and a 50p coin, replaces the original gift of clothing and provisions.

This year the £5 coin celebrates His Majesty's 75th birthday (in November) and the 50 pence coin commemorates the anniversary of the Windrush Generations.

It is a big commitment and hard work having an allotment, fighting the grass and weeds. It can also be frustrating when pigeons, rabbits or aphids, slugs and snails devastate crops, but the rewards are great.

Wembdon Parklands & Community Together

Summer is here at last! We've had so much rain during the long spring months that the weeds have gone crazy and there is a lot of work to do.

Sadly our waterbutts have been badly vandalised and the taps broken, so we have decided to build a wooden storage shed for their protection. You will see we have built a basic frame, which will be strengthened and clad with wood reclaimed from pallets. Access to the water taps will be locked and the branches of the trees will camoflage it.

The stumpery will come together over the summer months, as we move wood and stumps around and build knarly mounds of soil. Bark will be added and spaces will be left for planting in the Autumn. Over the winter months it will bed-in and by next spring we should have a show of woodland plants. Already there is a lot of wildlife including; all sorts of beetles, slow worms and toads.

Throughout the summer we will be maintaining the other feature borders; the sensory borders and the prairie are being pruned and weeded where we can due to the clay soil. This is a difficult task. Re-planting will be evaluated for next year where plants have died or there are gaps to fill. We plan to edge the sensory borders with heathers to keep the bark off the path in the Autumn.

We hope you are all enjoying these warm months. Many of you walk through the Parklands and stop to speak to us about the project and what we are doing which is very much apreciated. We desperately need volunteers who would like to give two hours a week on a Saturday or Sunday between10am until 12noon, to help keep the Parklands legacy alive.

Do you want to support children in Somerset? Then Route1 is looking for you!

Route1 Advocacy and Independent Visitors is a service that supports children and young people who are in care or have a social worker. They do this by matching volunteers with young people as either short term Advocates, or longer term Independ



either short term Advocates, or longer term Independent Visitors.

- Independent Visitors: These volunteers make a long term commitment to one child in care. They visit the child once or twice each month to build a trusting, supportive relationship and friendship that can sometimes last many years. This can bring lifechanging experiences and opportunities to a the child or young person – and their Independent Visitor!.
- Advocates: Volunteers work alongside individual children to ensure their voices are heard, and their wishes and feelings are taken into account when decisions are being made which affect them. Each child's support is usually short term and there is no expectation of a long term commitment to any particular child.

"I would strongly encourage local residents to come and help children and families, do some real long term good, use and expand their existing skills and experience and make a huge difference to young people in Somerset," said Cllr Tessa Munt, Lead Member for Children, Families & Education.
