

Parish Clerk's Notes



I hope that you all enjoyed the summer. What a strange one it was weather wise! We experienced both heavy rain and heatwaves. What a nightmare for gardeners and allotment holders!

The annual Village Day was again a great success. You can read more about this later in this edition.

Planning permission has finally been granted for the first phase of the Cokerhurst Farm housing development. By the time you read this work should have started to create new junctions on the A39 to give access to the developments on both sides of the road. This will inevitably cause more traffic through the village as people try to avoid the hold ups caused by traffic lights on the A39 and the temporary 20 mph speed limit. There is more about this in the Speedwatch article. One of the consequences of a major development such as this will be traffic disruption for many years, but at least it will provide affordable housing for people trying to get their foot on the property ladder.

Many people from the Parish and further afield visit the Parklands on a regular basis to enjoy the wonderful surroundings. All the work carried out to make this area so impressive is carried out by volunteers, which makes it all the more disappointing that vandalism regularly takes place and plants are being stolen or simply ripped up and discarded. The Parish Council is considering installing more CCTV cameras so that all areas are covered. What a sad situation this is. If anyone has any information regarding these crimes then please contact me, or the Police on 101 who are investigating.

Dog Fouling Poster Competition

The Parish Council has received complaints from members of the public for many years regarding dog fouling on pavements and in public areas. There continues to be a number of selfish dog owners in the parish who refuse to clean up after their dog has 'done its business'. The Parish Council has launched a campaign to tackle dog fouling. This included 'Scoop the Poop' on social media consisting of images with slogans to clean up after your dog.



Working with St George's School the Council invited the pupils to enter а competition to design a poster illustrating the problem. Α large number of excellent entries were received, all of which were of

a very high standard, and the Councillors had the difficult task of deciding on the winners. The 1st Prize as won by Bella Howard, with the entries by Evie Macriner and Angel Filian-Vorly being judged second and third. The winners are pictured with Councillor Chris Chalk who organised the competition.

Speed Indicators and Speedwatch

So here we are almost 6 months into the introduction of the 20 mph speed limit through the village. This was introduced after campaigning by your councillors, partially in anticipation of work starting on the A39 Quantock Road. This work is due to start on September 10th with a temporary 20 mph limit during working hours.

Somerset Council has recently offered ALL parishes the opportunity to apply for a 20 mph limit. This would have to be paid for by the parishes themselves at an estimated cost of £15,000. We managed to get ours through at NO COST to the parish, hence not increasing your Council Tax. The most beneficial aspect of the introduction so far is the decrease in traffic volume using Wembdon as a rat-run. Also, average speeds have decreased as you will see below.

The Police Speed Enforcement team have recently risk assessed the areas that can be operated in, and you will soon see both the Speedwatch Team and police officers in action.

We are aware that a number of drivers are still ignoring the limit, but with your continued support and by keeping to the 20 mph ourselves, we can reduce these speeds even further.

Average Speeds: Wembdon Rise from NDR – 21.03 mph (23.6 mph in Dec '22)

Wembdon Rise towards NDR (by Wares Lane) – 20.80 mph (23.09 mph in Dec '22)

Sandford Hill – 26.05 mph (85th % was 34 mph in Dec '22)

Traffic Volumes: From the NDR - 1,530 vehicles per day, down from 1,735 per day.

From Sandford Hill – 570 per day down from 717 per day.

Wares Lane – 1,005 per day down from 1,284 per day.

With plenty of car-booters and a record number of stalls from local charities and organisations lining the Playing Fields and Wembdon Common, many waiting patiently for the gates to open when the committee members arrived at 7:30AM. enjoyed the Classic Car Display for the 3rd year running, and a grand marching display from the Bridgwater Sea Cadet Corp. Children joined the fun on the many games and inflatables around the field which this year included some new challenges from the Wembdon Junior Football Teams. The BBQ and the Bar at The Green were busy throughout the day, with the BBQ once more providing the option of Welsh Cakes in the afternoon as well as the scrumptious Burgers and Hot Dogs.

On the Common there were various traditional fete stalls to be enjoyed by visitors, including Smash the Crockery, Hook-a-Duck and the Coconut Shy. Once again the visitors were entertained throughout the afternoon by Burtle Silver Band, while able to enjoy scrumptious cakes made by WCA volunteers and friends served from the Parish Centre Café. We must express our thanks to all who gave their time to make cakes for the stall.

The annual Fruit, Vegetable, Flower and Craft Show enjoyed an increased entry on last year, with several new exhibitors as well as many returning exhibitors, some of which have supported the show for many years. This year the best exhibit in show was awarded to Sally Rudge for her beautiful Sunflower Blanket, while Matilda Porter won the children's best exhibit in show for her magnificent Flower Arrangement in a Jam Jar. The "Sedgepaw" Dog Show also returned this year, with the "Best In Show" this year being awarded to Stanley,

owned by Tom Samotji, the cup now being proudly displayed in the Cottage Inn. The Children's Races were a success and entertainment on the village playing field was provided by Sedgemoor FM. As in previous years, the Village Hall hosted a Craft Fair, which was enjoyed by many looking to support small local businesses.

More allotments have become vacant. New tenants are taking over the plots quickly from the waiting list. New faces will become part of the allotment community.


