

The work on the new major housing developments on both sides of the A39 will be commencing shortly. The first phases of housing will be built on land in the Bridgwater Town Council area, so they will benefit from the large amounts of Community

Infrastructure Levy money paid by the developers long before we benefit from CIL relating to dwellings built on Wembdon land.

Somerset Playing Fields Association has announced the





The Parish Council uses the services of local professional tree surgeons to advise us regarding the maintenance work required to all the trees on its land. A recent inspection has shown that coppicing work will be required on some of the trees in the Parklands. You will see this work taking place over the next few weeks. No-one likes to see trees being cut however this is sometimes necessary. The Woodlands Trust website contains lots of useful information about the management of trees.

Speed Indicators and Speedwatch



20's Plenty for Us campaigns for 20mph as the default speed limit for urban and village streets where people live, work, shop, play and learn.

So here we are 9 months into the introduction of the 20-mph speed limit through the village. This was introduced after campaigning by your councillors, in anticipation of work starting on the A39 Quantock Road.

The developers of Cokerhurst Farm spoke to the Parish Councillors and a large number of parishioners prior to the October Parish Council meeting. The following matters were highlighted:

- A39 junction roadworks are expected to start mid-November taking 50 weeks, with a 20-mph limit in place & narrow lanes.
- Junction work will NOT be light controlled (except for some nighttime works) to ensure traffic flow and limit traffic cutting through Wembdon. Advance warning signage will be in place and letter drops to affected properties.
- Cavanna homes expect to start building in week 30 (June '24) with first sales March 2025 on the Cokerhurst site. Homes are expected to be built at a rate of 5 per month with 7% (16) of the first phase of 238 homes being classed as "affordable."
- A website will be set up shortly giving full details and Somerset Council will also have full details on their website.

The most beneficial aspect of the 20-mph introduction so far is the decrease in traffic volume using Wembdon as a rat-run. Also, average speeds have decreased as you will see below. Latest data:

Average Speeds:

Wembdon Rise from NDR – 20.68 mph (23.6 mph in Dec) Wembdon Rise (Wares Lane) – 20.54 mph (23.09 mph in Dec) Sandford Hill – 25.28 mph (34 mph in Dec '22)

Traffic Volumes:

From the NDR - 1,497 vehicles per day, down from 1,735 From Sandford Hill - 520 per day down from 717 Wembdon Rise (Wares Lane) - 971 per day down from 1,284

The <u>Speed Watch</u> team were active on October 30th after an enforced lay-off. In total **11 drivers** were reported to the police for driving above 25 mph. This was approximately 20% of vehicles. However, the top recorded speed was 32 mph which under the old 30 mph limit would not have been reported. We are, of course, aware that a number of drivers are still ignoring the limit, but with your continued support and by keeping to the 20 mph ourselves, we can reduce these speeds even further.

Wembdon Fireworks Display – 28th October 2023

The Grand Fireworks Display staged by the WCA certainly went with a bang in the early evening of Saturday 28th October 2023. In stormy weather conditions the WCA Committee members worked all afternoon with "Skyburst The Fireworks Company" to prepare the field for the professionally fired display.

The fireworks were prepared, barriers measured, collected and erected, refreshment tent prepared, and generator and lighting installed in time for the early arrivals. The Skyburst Team worked hard at the far edge of the field preparing the £2500 display. The rain was not kind to us and persisted on and off until just one hour before the display when it finally cleared. Unfortunately the earlier rain put a lot of people off, opting to stay at home in the warm and dry. Many though braved the elements and what a display we had in store for them. By the light of a full moon and with the rain clouds clearing the display proved even more spectacular and lasted longer than in previous years. As promised the display started relatively promptly which unfortunately caused a few latecomers to miss it and the earlier rain meant that the WCA incurred a financial loss on the event but after such a successful Village Day we were able to absorb the losses. Thanks must go to those with pets and livestock who heeded our many warnings of the event and to Asda and Morrison's Supermarkets for the kind sponsorships, along with all who helped in any way on the day or in the clearing of the field and cleaning up afterwards. The allotments are prepared for their winter rest. Here are some reflections of the Allotment Year.



Wembdon Parklands and Community Together



Another year has passed already, and we have had another busy year in the Parklands. This has been the year of The Stumpery and we have made great improvements to it with the help from our friends at Roberts Waste Ltd.

January - February. We had a meeting to plan the new projects including the stumpery and arranged a visit to

Roberts Waste, to choose the tree trunks we would need. The team prepared the ground around the stumpery clearing the weeds in preparation. We asked Harris Brothers & Collard Ltd for some safety fencing, which they kindly loaned us. We erected them around the site, to protect the public.

March - May, The stumps and tree trunks arrived, and the project began in earnest. We laid topsoil to level the ground to the same height as the pathway, positioned the logs and root balls and began putting landscaping bark down as a mulch to prevent weeds and retain moisture.

June - August. Further deliveries of bark were made to the stumpery and the project was taking shape. We also had a compound erected to store our equipment in.

September - December. The stumpery is finally complete, and we continued to carry out our normal tasks of weeding the borders. The year is ending with us planting heathers and bulbs along the Sensory Borders and the Stumpery.


