Parish Clerk's notes

At this time every year the Parish Council has to consider its budget for the following financial year, and the amount of precept that it charges the parishioners of Wembdon. This year has been very different to previous years. The dire financial problems being experienced by the newly formed Somerset Council have been well publicised. They are facing a deficit of £100 million in the next financial year just to make their budget balance. They say that

this means that they will have to consider reducing, or cutting out completely, a whole range of services that they currently provide. The list of services being considered includes playground maintenance, hedge and verge cutting at the side of the highway, public right of way maintenance, pavement and street sign maintenance, street and gulley cleaning, drain jetting, road sweeping, Community Safety (which includes CCTV in public areas and street & dog wardens) and fly tipping clearance.

The upshot of this is that if Town and Parish Councils across the whole of Somerset do not agree to take over the provision of these services then they will be reduced, or simply end. The Wembdon Parish Councillors met on 29th January to discuss how they were going to deal with this situation. Members of the public who attended the meeting asked questions and gave their views before the Councillors set their budget and precept demand. As it was not known exactly which services would be cut, and the cost of the Parish Council providing them instead was unknown, the Councillors were forced to make decisions without the full information. They agreed that they did not want any services to be cut, and so included a contingency figure of £20,000 in the budget to cover the costs associated with the devolution of services.

This will mean that a Band D Council Tax payer will pay an extra £1.26 a month to the Parish Council in 2024-25 compared to the current year. This is a wholly unsatisfactory situation, but the Councillors decided that their priority was for the current level of services to be maintained.

Community Speedwatch



It's now almost A YFAR since the introduction of the 20-mph speed limit through the village. YES - it's not, and never was, going to stop those people who insist on speeding, sometimes as fast as 70mph! The only thing that will stop the habitual speeders enforcement. and the certainty being of

caught, which we know is not realistic, or possible, especially in the current financial climate.

However, the most beneficial aspect of the 20-mph introduction so far is the decrease in traffic volume using Wembdon as a ratrun.

DOWN – the volume of traffic coming from Sandford roundabout through the village has fallen from an average of 717 vehicles per day to 426, a drop of almost 300 vehicles! From the NDR towards the village a drop from 1,735 vehicles per day to 1,444! Again almost 300 fewer movements – the school run partially accounts for the higher figures.

DOWN – the average speeds have fallen, in ALL locations we measure, by up to 5 mph which is considerable. The average on Sandford Hill is now 25.68 mph and on Wembdon Rise from the NDR is 20.74 mph.

Thank you to the SPEEDWATCH team who were active on February 2nd with a total of 14 drivers being reported to the police for driving above 25 mph including one with no tax. This was approximately 5% of vehicles recorded at that spot on Wembdon Rise by the Inwood Road junction. Those drivers will receive warning letters from Avon & Somerset Police. The SPEEDWATCH team are always on the lookout for new recruits who can spare an hour or two a month to help out with the monitoring. Please contact the clerk with your details if you're interested.

The impact of the Cokerhurst junction work on the A39, now due to have started on February 12th, will be closely monitored by councillors. We can expect vehicles to try to circumvent any delays by cutting through the village - so watch this space!

FINALLY-THANK YOU to all those residents who are acting responsibly and driving to the speed limit. Your actions will, hopefully, help to keep Wembdon as a safe place to walk, cycle and drive.

The Wembdon Neighbourhood Plan is almost 5 years old. A review is currently under way, conducted by a steering group appointed by Wembdon Parish Council. There will be more information on this in the next Parish Paper.


The Eco-Schools Team said, "Congratulations to everyone for the great work you have managed to do, earning your Green Flag with style. You should all be very proud"

Wembdon Parish Defibrillators

There are three defibrillators accessible in the village.



- On the outside wall of the Cottage Inn, Wembdon Hill.
- On the outside wall of St George's Parish Centre. This has been recently relocated from within Wembdon Village Hall for faster accessibility.
- 3. On the outside of Wembdon Cricket Club's equipment store, to the right of the main building, Wembdon Village Hall, The Green, Homberg Way. This is owned by the sports clubs, but is available for use by anyone needing it.

Procedure for how to access these devices.

This is a brief summary, as shown on the board next to the cabinets.

- Call 999 for help. If there is a device situated within a short distance of where the casualty is, you will be advised where it is. If there is someone else present, they could collect the defibrillator. If you are alone, follow the advice of the 999 call handler, leaving the line open and on speaker.
- Start chest compressions.
- If advised, you can use the defibrillator. Do not be alarmed, it
 will only give a shock if it is needed, the device will talk you
 through all the steps needed. Keep the line open so the call
 handler can speak to you about what to do next.
- Don't forget, you could save a life!

This is not intended to be a full description of what to do in the case of sudden collapse. If you would like to have training, then we hope to make arrange a new session in the next few months, or you can check out https://www.resus.org.uk


