

Parish Clerk's notes

The theme of this issue of the Parish Paper is the commemoration of the 80th Anniversary of the D-Day Landings, which I am sure you know took place on 6th June 1944. There will be a number of events taking place in the parish, which are detailed in the next few pages. The finale will be the lighting of the beacon at the allotments at 9.15pm on June 6th. This is a national event, and the vantage point enjoyed by the allotments should mean that many other beacons will be able to be seen.

The D-Day anniversary holds special significance for me, as both my father Robert and my Uncle Maurice were involved in the landings. Maurice was in the Royal Navy, and he served on one of the ships that patrolled the channel whilst my father was in the Gloucestershire regiment and landed on Sword beach, after crossing the channel in a landing craft. By the evening of June 6, the British had advanced about eight kilometres deep to the west of the Orne River. This was where my father was wounded.

There was a thick forest, with a clearing the size of a tennis court in the trees. The British troops had been advancing through the forest and they met a contingent of German soldiers on the other side of the clearing. Heavy fire was exchanged for a while, before my father's commander shouted, 'Advance' and his troops ran forward. My father was shot in the foot and fell. The British retreated, leaving Dad and other wounded men lying in agony in no man's land with bullets flying just above them. When darkness fell, an unknown hero broke from the British ranks, and pulled Dad back to safety. My father never discovered the identity of this man who saved his life. Like a lot of World War Two veterans my father never talked about the war.

I am sure that there are many Wembdon parishioners who also have stories to tell about their ancestors' involvement in the D-Day landings. I hope that you can join the Parish Councillors at the lighting of Wembdon Beacon.

National Fish and Chip Day

This is something to mark this historic occasion, so please bring the family and watch the beacon being lit. Hopefully we will be able to see many other beacons, from the excellent viewpoint towards the Bristol Channel. You may park in the road, but not on the allotment path, to ensure the safety of everyone.

There will also be national events, which can be followed by watching or listening to your usual news channels.

Councillor Chris Chalk shares some of his family's experiences from World War 2

I am originally from Chichester in West Sussex which is on the South Coast. Along with the East of England this part of the country was effectively the 'front line' during the summer of 1940 experiencing air assaults from the German Airforce for much of the war including of course the Battle of Britain.

This year's anniversary remembers a pivotable moment during World War 2. However, I would also like to include the efforts leading up to D Day from the home front in which my family took a role. My link to D Day is towards the end.

My family (on Mum's side) originated from Southsea in Portsmouth which, along with many other towns and cities in the United Kingdom, was targeted by the Luftwaffe during the Blitz. Three major raids took place on Portsmouth. One of these raids commenced on 10th January 1941. This changed the life of Mum's family forever. During the raid Mum went 'missing' but fortunately a gallant Royal Marine spotted Mum and swept her up into his great coat and returned her to my Gran.

The family lost their home and moved some 20 miles eastward to a small village called Chidham. Here, Gran joined the Land Army looking after the cows along with many other duties. On one occasion during the early morning a German fighter plane attacked both Gran and the cows, a dairy herd. Gran, who was incensed at the affront of the enemy pilot shooting at her cows proceeded to chase after the plane shaking her fist and shouting "You stupid thing" at the aircraft.

Thankfully there were no casualties, and the plane was brought down by an anti-aircraft battery a couple of miles away.

Grandad Raymond stayed in Portsmouth serving with the Auxiliary Fire Service driving a Dennis engine. Grandad was presumed dead no less than six times, however he always returned home having survived another night of falling bombs and burning buildings.

Grandad survived the war and became a long-distance lorry driver. He was tragically killed on a road traffic accident, a head on collision by a driver who had fallen asleep at the wheel in 1963.

My second cousin on my dad's side, Sonner, was a 16-year-old lad at the time of the Normandy landings on 6th June 1944. He was an able seaman serving on the tugsboats. He was part of the massive support & logistical



operation to maintain a never-ending supply of everything required to carry the war onto Berlin. This included the formation of the Mulberry Harbours which were massive temporary landing stages erected to supply the allied armies. This photo shows a section of Mulberry being towed by tugboats.

Sonner, along with his crew, transported a section of the harbours. Each section was enormous and made of concrete. The idea was to assemble the sections in Normandy, where each section would be sunk along with many other similar sections and connected to make the harbour. Parts of the British 'Mulberry' can still be seen at Arromanches to this day. Sonner's tug crossed the Channel, eventually completing its task and began to make its way home. This is where tragedy struck. The English Channel was not completely free of the German Navy raiding and harassing allied shipping. During the return journey Sonner's tug was attacked by a German torpedo. All of the tug's crew were killed except Sonner who miraculously survived.

I only met Sonner a couple of times before he died. He was a quiet and private man who was just one of thousands of men and women who sacrificed so much to enable us to have the life we have today.

I hope that you have found my family's wartime experiences interesting.

Community Speedwatch



It's now more than a year since the introduction of the 20-mph speed limit through the village. Sadly, it's not, and never was, going to stop those people who insist on speeding, sometimes as fast as 70mph!

The most beneficial aspect of the 20-mph introduction so far is the decrease in

traffic volume using Wembdon as a rat-run. We have, as expected, seen an increase in traffic flow since work has started on the Cokerhurst development.

Vehicle movements per day have risen from an average of 481 per day in February to 561 in May coming from the Cannington roundabout through the village. This would be acceptable except for the fact that many of these drivers are racing through and exceeding the speed limit. We should, however, remember that prior to the introduction of the 20 mph limit we were getting an average of 717 per day on this route.

Thank you to the SPEEDWATCH team who were active on April 23rd with a total of 15 drivers being reported to the police for driving above 26 mph. This was approximately 11% of vehicles recorded at that spot on Wembdon Hill between 4.30 – 5.30 p.m. Those drivers will receive warning letters from A&S Police force. Two vehicles were recorded at 40+ mph which should mean the drivers will get a hand-delivered warning from a police officer.

We are also hoping that the police will start enforcing the dangerous parking that is evident around the village, especially where there are dropped kerbs and at junctions e.g. where Hollow Lane meets Wembdon Hill. Large vehicles, including delivery lorries and tractors, are finding it increasingly difficult to manoeuvre. Also, inconsiderate parking on the top of Wembdon Hill has, on occasion, caused the double-decker bus to be unable to get through on its way to Cannington.

The SPEEDWATCH team are always on the lookout for new recruits who can spare an hour or two a month to help out with the monitoring. Please contact the clerk with your details if you're able to help.

FINALLY-THANK YOU to all those residents who are acting responsibly and driving to the speed limit. Your actions will, hopefully, help to keep Wembdon as a safe place to walk, cycle and drive.

ATTENTION DOG OWNERS

There are designated areas of the park where dogs should be kept on a lead. These areas are clearly marked, so please observe them. The Somerset Council Dog Wardens patrol these areas and are empowered to issue fines to people ignoring the restriction. Don't let this be you!


